Welcome to the joint weekly newsletter of Christ Church and the Bridgwater Drive Church.

Sunday 6 December 10am - Advent II, All Age, already fully booked.

Following the announcement of the end of lockdown and the return to tiers, the CC Elders met (via Zoom) on Tuesday. And the BDC Elders consulted via email and phone and decided that for the rest of 2020 there should be **no week-day meetings** in the church buildings. But I am pleased to say that both churches agreed that Sunday worship should take place in both church buildings. **BUT:**

We are in Tier 2, which is now stricter than it was pre-lockdown and it is very important that people do not socialise inside the building before or after the service. If people cannot stick to that rule we will be forced to close the church again. Full details of all the December services, the restrictions, advice on attendance and how to 'book' your place are in the church specific notice (separate for Christ Church and Bridgwater Drive) attached to this N&C. PLEASE READ IT CAREFULLY. Most people, even the Prime Minister, and especially the scientists are saying that there is still a great deal of risk and while there will be a relaxation of restrictions for five days over Christmas, people should act responsibly and limit interactions and/or meet people outdoors as much as possible.


DEVOTION this week's 'devotion' is interactive

The two House Group meetings in Advent are discussing Advent related questions from the book *A Strange Christmas* by Krish Kandiah. Advent is four weeks long and we only have two sessions. So, here are some questions from the book's session 3, which are quite fun and you might like to reflect on at home (possibly while playing/singing Christmas music).

Read Psalm 98:1-9, which was the inspiration for Isaac Watt's carol Joy to the World

What is your all-time favourite Christmas song/carol and why?

Why do you think the Bible records so many 'songs' as part of the Christmas story?





If you were to write your own Christmas song, what would your inspiration be? (snow, food, family, angels, the nativity...)

In our house, it isn't Christmas until we've listened to Handel's Messiah. This is my mum's influence – growing up, she used to sing it in her church choir every year. And growing up, it wasn't Christmas until dad and I put the lights up round the front door (usually about 2 weeks before Christmas, certainly not before).

- 2. "Threats to society"
- "The Bible includes many instances of the subversive call of God. God repeatedly selects the seemingly weak for powerful roles. While much of the prevailing culture in the West today is based on celebrity and attainment positively at odds with much of Christian faith."
- * Find a song, film or section of the Bible that has challenged you or led you to change your behaviour. Listen, watch or read and reflect on it.
- * Photocopy an image of yourself, where you live, or the church. Draw on it changes you would make if you could. Then ask yourself why you would make those changes. How might God have guided you? If you choose the church, share your ideas they may be changes others want to see too!

Thank you to Gwyneth for providing our prayer themes.




