
Welcome to the joint weekly newsletter of Christ Church and the Bridgwater Drive Church.

GREAT BIG ART EXHIBITION

Museums and leading artists are inviting the British public to take part in what they hope will be the biggest art exhibition ever mounted. The Great Big Art Exhibition is being launched by Sir Antony Gormley, who is asking people to make an artwork at home and put it in their window or garden. "At a time when all the theatres and galleries are shut it is wonderful to somehow tap into the extraordinary reservoirs of creativity in the country and celebrate the diversity of range and thought and feelings that exist," Sir Antony said. **He has suggested animals as the theme for the first two weeks** of the Exhibition.

Every two weeks, a different artist will choose a subject for the public to respond to in what the organisers hope will be a rolling nationwide exhibition, ending on 30 April. Read the whole article here:

- Display your artwork. This could be on the inside of your window facing out, inside your home to be photographed for social media, or in your garden or outdoor space where it can be seen by other people if possible.
