Our Bible reading today is from **Mark 5, verses 21 to 43** and it's about Jesus doing some healing. While you're listening to this story, can you think about what the most important thing is to you in the story, and if you have any questions that you would like answered about the story.

Jesus got into the boat again and went back to the other side of the lake, where a large crowd gathered around him on the shore. Then a leader of the local synagogue (Jewish church), whose name was Jairus, arrived. When he saw Jesus, he fell at his feet, pleading passionately with him. "My little daughter is dying," he said. "Please come and lay your hands on her; heal her so she can live."

Jesus went with him, and all the people followed, crowding around him. A woman in the crowd had suffered for 12 years with constant bleeding. She had suffered a great deal from many doctors, and over the years she had spent everything she had to pay them, and she had gotten no better. In fact, she had gotten worse. She had heard about Jesus, so she came up behind him in the crowd and touched his robe. For she thought to herself, "If I can just touch his robe, I will be healed." Immediately the bleeding stopped, and she could feel in her body that she had been healed of her terrible condition.

Jesus realised at once that healing power had gone out from him, so he turned around in the crowd and asked, "Who touched my robe?"

He disciples said to him, "Look at this crowd pressing around you. How can you ask, 'Who touched me?'"

But he kept on looking around to see who had done it. Then the frightened woman, trembling at the realisation of what had happened to her, came and fell to her knees in front of him and told him what she had done. And he said to her, "Daughter your faith has made you well. Go in peace. Your suffering is over."

While he was still speaking to her, messengers arrived from the home of Jairus, the leader of the synagogue. They told him, "Your daughter is dead. There's no use troubling the teacher now."

But Jesus overheard them and said to Jairus, "Don't be afraid. Just have faith."

Then Jesus stopped the crowd and wouldn't let anyone go with him except Peter, James, and John (the brother of James). When they came to the home of the synagogue leader, Jesus saw much commotion and weeping and wailing. He went inside and asked, "Why all this commotion and weeping? The child isn't dead; she's only asleep."

The crowd laughed at him. But he made them all leave, and he took the girl's father and mother and his three disciples into the room where the girl was lying. Holding her hand, he said to her, "Talitha Koum," which means "Little girl, get up!" And the girl who was twelve years old, immediately stood up and walked around! They were overwhelmed and totally amazed. Jesus gave them strict orders not to tell anyone what had happened, and then he told them to give her something to eat.

Let's talk about our Bible verses

Mickey was listening to today's bible story too, weren't you Mickey?

S: Well, there could be a couple of reasons for this, I think Jesus was feeling kindness for Jairus and the family, who would have been in quite a state with their daughter ill and now possibly dead. Also, Jesus was trying to keep a low profile, (although not really succeeding with this), as he didn't want a major clash with the Jewish leaders as he still had a lot to do.

M: So why didn't the Jewish leaders like Jesus?

S: They didn't all dislike Jesus. In fact, Jairus must have believed in Jesus to fall at his feet and ask for his help. But unfortunately, like many people today, the Jewish leaders didn't like the fact that Jesus had a different way of looking at things. Jesus was more interested in helping people like the woman who was ill in this story, than in keeping old, outdated, rules and regulations that seemed to hold people back from doing the right thing. Any other questions?

M: yes, what did they give the little girl to eat after she got up?

S: Trust you Mickey, to be thinking about food! We aren't told what she had to eat, but it could have been olives and bread I suppose, that's the sort of thing they might have had then.

So, Mickey, what part of the today's bible reading is important to you?

M: Well, I think the most important part is that they gave the little girl something to eat, because I'm hungry right now, so have you got any bananas?

S: Honestly, Mickey, what I am going to do with you? Say good bye Mickey.

M: goodbye Mickey!

Help us to see things the way that you do,

To look with kindness on others and help when we can,

We believe in you God, help us to have faith and believe.
