Talk

Here we are once more at the beginning of a new year when we reflect on what has been and what may be. It is a time when we remember those whom we have lost; those things that we could have done better and ask forgiveness for those whom we have hurt, however unwittingly.

But a new year is also a time to reflect as Christians as to what has been the sustaining love that has accompanied us in the past and will continue to do so in the year ahead. I think this is particularly important for us in Christ Church as we have major questions to consider and decisions to take.. with regard and crowned them with glory to our proposed building project.

The first of our readings Psalm 8 is a psalm of praise, for as King David says at both the beginning and end "Adonai our Lord, how excellent is Your Name over all the earth" He asks God, how after all he has created, he cares for mere mortals? He has created them inferior only to himself and crowned them with glory and honour. God has appointed them rulers over everything he has made. You might well say this is all in the past but what has it do with us in the 21st. century?

The answer is everything for he is still with us. God is our past and our future and furthermore gave us the gift of Jesus Christ! Our new testament The reading from St. Matthew's gives us an idea of what that gift means for us. The parable contained in this reading is one of the most vivid in the Gospels and for once the lesson is crystal clear! God will judge us in reaction to human need. His judgement does not depend on the knowledge we have amassed, or the fame we have required, or even the fortune we may have acquired – No!! we shall be judged on the help that we have given. If we read this parable it gives some understanding about the help we must give.

Firstly, it must be help in simple things, like feeding a hungry person or giving a thirsty person a drink, welcoming a stranger, cheering the sick, visiting the prisoner are things that any one can do and I must admit that one of the things that has saddened me most in the last year has been the lack of enthusiasm shown in starting up the drop-in café and then the warm space initiative. These are easy things for us to do. They do not require us to give away vast sums of money, or writing our names in the annals of history, just humility and kindness shown to our fellow man,

Secondly it must be help that is uncalculating. In the parable those who helped did not think that they were helping Christ and thus getting eternal merit for themselves; they helped because they responded to their natural instinct, an uncalculating reaction of a loving heart. The people who had not helped said of course if they had known they were helping him they would have done so, but they only saw some insignificant being, not worthy of their help. Help given out of a desire to reap praise, but that is not help in the true sense of the word and indeed it is not generosity, it is disguised selfishness. The help that wins God's approval is that given for no other reason than a desire to help.

Finally, we are confronted with the a great truth that all such help is given to Jesus and help which is withheld is withheld from Jesus. If for example, we really wish to bring delight to those who are parents, if we really want to move them to gratitude the best way to do it is to help the children, hence the need for foodbanks, for toy banks for free school meals, which all bring joy to parents as they see them as helping them to help their children. God is a wonderful Father and the way to delight his helps others in the simplest heart is to help the children as well as our fellow men and women. When we accept the lesson that generosity given without any hidden agenda, helps others in the simplest things, we too will know the joy of helping Jesus Christ himself.

So let us move forward in 2023, resolving to help others. Our building project for example, will cost a great deal of money, but in the end it will hopefully help us to create partnerships within the community that will help others, equally, our warm space will help to give others a time away from cold homes whilst giving them hot drinks and a cake or a biscuit and in doing so may we know that we have delighted not only God, but also our Saviour Jesus Christ.

Loving Creator God, Help us to help others not counting the cost or advantage to ourselves, but giving help from a loving heart. **Amen**
